Even when repurposing materials or reimagining familiar objects, clever design can be strikingly original. *Compiled by ISABELLE CHESHER*

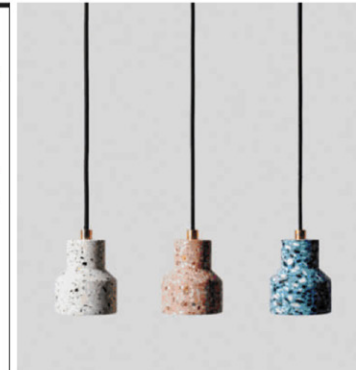
